

December 17, 2023 – Third Sunday of Advent

One Who is Coming: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Third Sunday of Advent – He is not Elijah returned from the heavens (see <u>2</u><u>Kings 2:11</u>), although like him he dresses in the prophet's attire (see <u>Mark 1:6</u>; <u>2</u><u>Kings 1:8</u>) and preaches repentance and judgment (see <u>1</u><u>Kings 18:21</u>; <u>2</u><u>Chronicles 21:12–15</u>). Not Elijah in the flesh, John is nonetheless sent in the spirit and power of Elijah to fulfil his mission (see <u>Luke 1:17</u>; <u>Malachi 3:23–24</u>). Neither is John the prophet Moses foretold, although he is a kinsman and speaks God's word (see <u>Deuteronomy 18:15–19</u>; John 6:14). Nor is John the Messiah, though he has been anointed by the Spirit since he was in the womb (see <u>Luke 1:15</u>, <u>44</u>). John prepares the way for the Lord (see <u>Isaiah 40:3</u>). The baptism he performs is symbolic, not sacramental. It is a sign given to stir our hearts to repentance. John shows us the One upon whom the Spirit remains (see John <u>1:32</u>), the One who fulfils the promise we hear in today's First Reading (see <u>Luke 4:16–21</u>). Jesus' bath of rebirth and the Spirit opens a fountain that purifies Israel and gives to all a new heart and a new Spirit (see <u>Zechariah 13:1–3</u>; <u>Ezekiel 36:24–27</u>; <u>Mark 1:8</u>; <u>Titus 3:5</u>). John comes to us in the Advent readings to show us the light, that we might believe in the One who comes at Christmas. As we sing in today's Responsorial, the Mighty One has come to lift each of us up, to fill our hunger with bread from heaven (see John 6:33, 49–51). And as Paul exhorts in today's Epistle, we should rejoice, give thanks, and pray without ceasing that God will make us perfectly holy in spirit, soul, and body—that we may be blameless when our Lord comes.

Advent Penitential Hour: Friday evenings in Advent from 6-7pm on 8, 15 & 22 December[.] During the penitential season of Advent, on these three Fridays we are holding an hour of Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament with the opportunity for individual confession.

Music at Christmas – The three music groups at St Boniface are looking forward to preparing the music for Christmas. For the 5:30pm Vigil Mass on 24 December speak with Guada. For the 11:00am Mass on 25 December speak with Mike Wood. For the 5:30pm evening Mass on 25 December speak with Vicky. If you would like to sing traditional Christmas carols in a 4-part harmony, there will be a short Carol Service with Readings before Midnight Mass. Please speak with Mike Wood after the 11:00am Mass if you would like to support this and sing during Midnight Mass as well. The final practice for the Midnight Carol Service and Mass, will take place on **Thursday 21 December, 8-9pm in the St Margaret Clitherow Room**.

Candles for Christmas – Wednesday 20 December. Drop in between 5:30pm and 7:30pm. Come and light a candle for Christmas. There will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament the whole time, confession available and carols sung, making it the perfect opportunity to spend some time in peace with Jesus and remember the reason for the season. **This is an outreach event**, not just for our parishioners but for the whole community– so why not bring a friend along? If you would like to help, please sign up at the back of church. There will be mince pies and hot drinks available.

This is Advance Information that there will be **NO Exposition/Benediction on Saturday December 23**. This is to allow time to decorate the Church for our Christmas celebrations.
