February 18, 2024 – FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

The New Creation: Scott Hahn Reflects on the First Sunday of Lent - Lent bids us to return to the innocence of our baptism. As Noah and his family were saved through the waters of the deluge, we were saved through the waters of Baptism, Peter reminds us in today's Epistle. And God's covenant with Noah in today's First Reading marked the start of a new world. But it also prefigured a new and greater covenant between God and His creation (see <u>Hosea 2:20</u>; <u>Isaiah 11:1-9</u>). We see that new covenant and that new creation begin in today's Gospel. Jesus is portrayed as the new Adam—the beloved son of God (see Mark 1:11; Luke 3:38), living in harmony with the wild beasts (see Genesis 2:19-20), being served by angels (see Ezekiel 28:12-14). Like Adam, He too is tempted by the devil. But while Adam fell, giving reign to sin and death (see Romans 5:12-14, 17-20), Jesus is victorious. This is the good news, the "gospel of God" that He proclaims. Through His death, resurrection, and enthronement at the right hand of the Father, the world is once again made God's kingdom. In the waters of Baptism, each of us entered the kingdom of His beloved Son (see Colossians 1:13-14). We were made children of God, new creations (see <u>a Corinthians 5:7</u>; Galatians <u>4:3-7</u>). But like Jesus, and Israel before Him, we have passed through the baptismal waters only to be driven into the wilderness—a world filled with afflictions and tests of our faithfulness (see 1 Corinthians 10:1-4, 9,13; Deuteronomy 8:2, 16). We are led on this journey by Jesus. He is the Saviour —the way and the truth we sing of in today's Psalm (see John 14:6). He feeds us with the bread of angels (see Psalm 78:25; Wisdom 16:20), and cleanses our consciences in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As we begin this holy season, let us renew our baptismal vows—to repent and believe the gospel.

From Bishop Philip Egan: "Now is the favourable time; this is the day of salvation (2 Cor 6: 2). We are now entering the joyful season of Lent, a time of real personal renewal and - I would like to suggest - a time of renewal for us all as the People of God within our Diocese of Portsmouth. This Lent, I wish to invite everyone in the Diocese, clergy and faithful in our schools and parishes, to undertake with big-heartedness the three Lenten works of prayer, self-denial, and charity, offering them for the renewal and the mission of the Church in our Diocese. May we bring many more souls closer to Jesus Christ through His Church. Let's pray to God for His grace and for the gifts of His Holy Spirit that we might 'turn the ship."

Lenten programme at St Boniface: we pray for a deep spiritual renewal, as we undertake this beautiful journey to prepare for the celebration of Easter. Jesus asks us to deepen our prayer life, to practise self-denial and to give special attention to works of charity.

We will then have Eucharistic Adoration until 8:30pm, with the opportunity for individual confession.
