January 14, 2024 – SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Hearing the Call: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time - In the call of Samuel and of the first Apostles, today's readings shed light on our own calling to be followers of Christ. Notice in the Gospel today that John's disciples are prepared to hear God's call. They are already looking for the Messiah, so they trust in John's word and follow when he points out the Lamb of God walking by. Samuel is also waiting on the Lord—sleeping near the Ark of the Covenant where God's glory dwells, taking instruction from Eli, the high priest. Samuel listened to God's word and the Lord was with him. And Samuel, through his word, turned all Israel to the Lord (see 1 Samuel 3:21; 7:2–3). The disciples too heard and followed words we hear repeatedly in today's Gospel. They stayed with the Lord and by their testimony brought others to the Lord. These scenes from salvation history should give us strength to embrace God's will and to follow His call in our lives. God is constantly calling to each of us—personally, by name (see Isaiah 43:1; John 10:3). He wants us to seek Him in love, to long for His word (see Wisdom 6:11–12). We must desire always, as the apostles did, to stay where the Lord stays, to constantly seek His face (see Psalm 42:2). For we are not our own, but belong to the Lord, as Paul says in today's Epistle. We must have ears open to obedience and write His word within our hearts. We must trust in the Lord's promise—that if we come to Him in faith, He will abide with us (see John 15:14; 14:21–23), and raise us by His power. And we must reflect in our lives the love He has shown us, so that others too may find the Messiah. As we renew our vows of discipleship in this Eucharist, let us approach the altar singing the new song of today's Psalm: "Behold I come . . . to do your will O God."

AHEAD of this year's Second Collection for the Cathedral of St John the Evangelist, Mother Church of the Diocese, which is scheduled to take place on 21 January, Father James McAuley, Cathedral Dean, Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia writes,

"I became Dean of our Cathedral Church of St John the Evangelist in September 2022. Since then, the parish has paid for emergency repairs of serious leaks in the Blessed Sacrament and St Patrick chapels, and in the Discovery Centre, which cost £23,060 in total. The cost of these repairs was paid for by parishioners, who responded generously to an appeal for contributions. In January 2023, the 120year-old West Window began to collapse because of deterioration in the lead work. Its restoration was completed in December 2023 at an estimated final cost of more than £100,000. So far, we have raised almost £38,000 towards the cost of restoration of the West Window. These projects have used up virtually all the Cathedral's available funds. The heating and electrical systems are in urgent need of upgrading. One of the three boilers, which heats the Cathedral and Cathedral House, has been broken since spring 2022. The money I had allocated to replace it had to be diverted to pay for the repairs to the West Window. The two remaining boilers both failed in late November 2023. After a week of no central heating, the two boilers were repaired, but we have been advised that all three boilers have come to the end of their useful life, having been installed about 25 years ago. We have no money to replace the boilers, never mind upgrade the heating system to a more energy efficient, "greener" system. In the summer of 2023, the quinquennial architectural survey was completed and the report we received in September outlined work required over the next five years to the roof, windows, heating, and electrical systems at an estimated cost of more than £1 million. I fully appreciate the financial pressures being felt by you and by your parishioners but would appeal to you to promote and support the Second Collection for the Cathedral on 21st January. Never has this annual collection by parishes for the Mother Church of the Diocese been more critical or needed. Your support is vitally important to us."

Enthronement of the Santo Niño (Child Jesus) Statue – A group of Filipino parishioners recently acquired a replica of the statue of the Child Jesus venerated in the famous Basilica of the Santo Niño on the island of Cebu in the Philippines. They also acquired from the Rector of the Basilica a relic containing the cloth of the inner garment of the original statue, which dates to almost 502 years ago. In Philippine history, the statue was presented by Ferdinand Magellan, a famous world naval explorer, to Hara Amihan, the queen of Zubu (Cebu). Written accounts said that she joyfully leaped and danced the "sulog" or the dance of the tides when the image was entrusted to her. This event marked the beginning of the Sinulog Festival, which honours the Feast of the Child Jesus every second Sunday after Epiphany. It is with great joy that this replica will be enthroned at St Boniface on 21 January at the end of the 11am Mass. The Eucharistic celebration will be followed by the Sinulog festival in the church hall, where there will be prayers, dancing (Sulog) and fellowship. Everybody is welcome.
