September 10, 2023 – TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

To Win Them Back: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time: As Ezekiel is appointed watchman over the house of Israel in today's first Reading, so Jesus in the Gospel today establishes His disciples as guardians of the new Israel of God, the Church (see Galatians 6:16). He also puts in place procedures for dealing with sin and breaches of the faith, building on rules of discipline prescribed by Moses for Israel (see Leviticus 19:17–20; Deuteronomy 19:13). The heads of the new Israel, however, receive extraordinary powers—similar to those given to Peter (see Matthew 16:19). They have the power to bind and loose, to forgive sins and to reconcile sinners in His name (see John 20:21-23). But the powers He gives the Apostles, and their successors depend on their communion with Him. As Ezekiel is only to teach what he hears God saving, so the disciples are to gather in His name and to pray and seek the will of our heavenly Father. But today's readings are more than a lesson in Church order. They also suggest how we're to deal with those who trespass against us, a theme that we'll hear in next week's readings as well. Notice that both the Gospel and the First Reading presume that believers have a duty to correct sinners in our midst. Ezekiel is even told that he will be held accountable for their souls if he fails to speak out and try to correct them. This is the love that Paul in today's Epistle says we owe to our neighbours. To love our neighbours as ourselves is to be vitally concerned for their salvation. We must make every effort, as Jesus says, to win our brothers and sisters back, to turn them from the false paths. We should never correct out of anger or a desire to punish. Instead, our message must be that of today's Psalm—urging the sinner to hear God's voice, not to harden their hearts, and to remember that He is the one who made us, the rock of our salvation.

The Holy Name of Mary, 12 September – a Solemnity for the Oblates of the Virgin Mary! Bishop Philip Egan writes: "This feast originated in Spain and was approved in 1513 and in 1683, Pope Innocent XI extended its celebration to the universal Church, four days after the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Mother (8th September). Following the Vatican Council II, the feast was removed from the universal calendar, although the Votive Mass remained, but Pope John Paul II, in the third edition of the *Roman Missal*, restored it as an optional memorial. The name *Mary* is rooted in various ancient languages: in Hebrew Myriam; in Aramaic Maryam; in the Greek Old Testament, Mariam; and in Greek and Latin New Testament, Maria. Modern philological studies suggest that Mary means 'lady, beautiful one, or wellbeloved,' which fits well with the message of the Archangel Gabriel: "Hail, Mary, full of grace [or Rejoice, O highly favoured daughter. The Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women" (Luke 1:28). The name "Mary," being the name of the Blessed Mother, deserves special respect and devotion. She is the Mother of our Divine Saviour and is rightfully called "Mother of God," for Jesus true God, second Person of the Holy Trinity, entered this world becoming also true man through Mary, who had conceived Him by the power of the Holy Spirit. Again, the very mention of her name reminds us that she is full of grace and is blessed among all women. Thirdly, Mary is a maternal name, because she is our Mother, whom our Lord gave to us as He was dying on the cross (cf. John19:26-27). Finally, Mary is a name of the mother who responds to all of our needs, protects us from evil, and prays "for us sinners now and at the hour of our death." Blessed be the Name of Mary, Virgin and Mother! Fr Tom adds: "When Venerable Pio Bruno Lanteri founded the Oblates of the Virgin Mary back in 1814, he wanted our Congregation to be under the special protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He himself had a profound devotion to Mary, since from his personal experience she led him to love Jesus more and follow Him more closely. He chose as the special titular feast of our Congregation the feast of the Holy Name of Mary. Please pray that all Oblates today may imitate the virtues of the Blessed Virgin Mary and be faithful in their life of religious consecration and in their apostolic mission. May the Lord also grant us vocations!"
